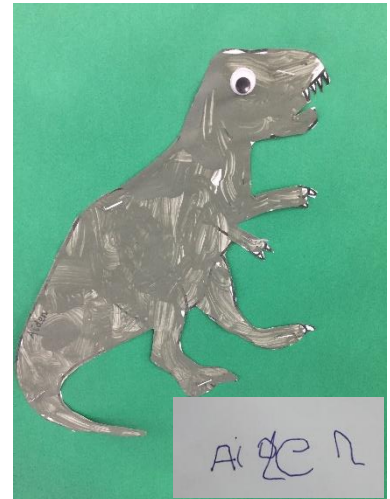
There is only three weeks left of this academic year, school will close for the summer break on Friday 26th July at 12.15pm.

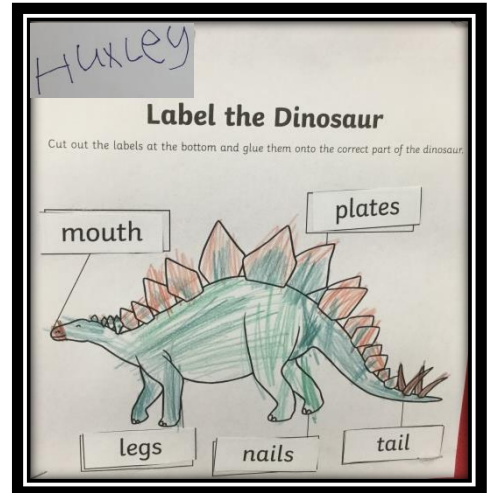
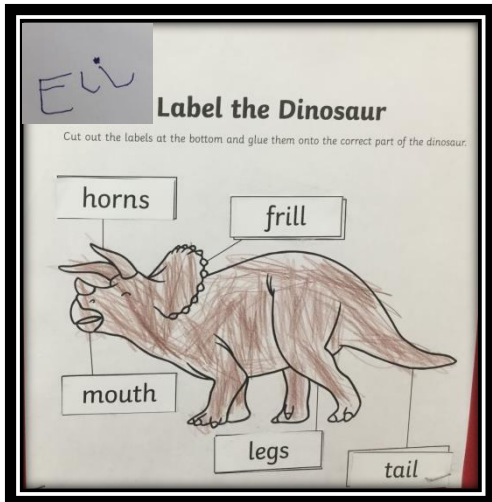
Hello from EYFS!

We are learning about Dinosaurs this term and the children are super excited!

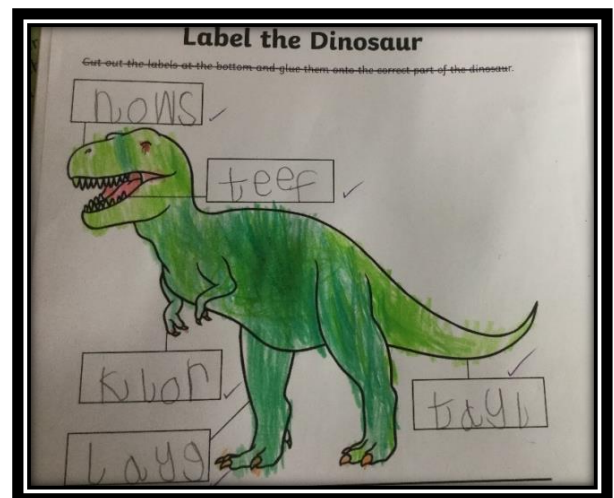
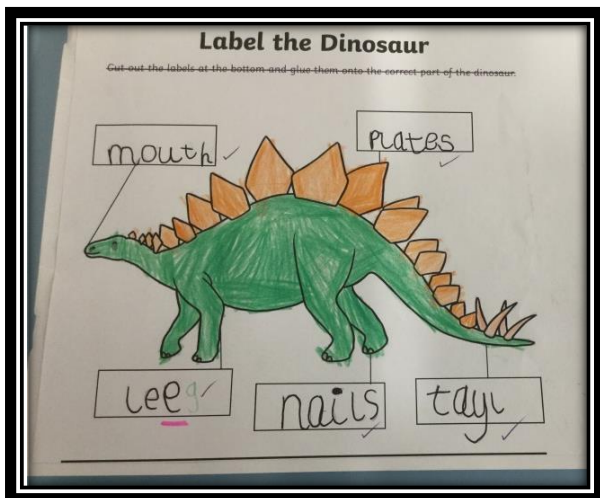


The children labelled their dinosaurs.

In our Switch on Science activities this term, we have been looking at changes in materials.
